

A HOUSE **OF PRAYER**

We are a **house of prayer**, committed to **worship, grow,** and **go.** Prayer is worshipful dependence and communion with God that spurs growth and energizes us to go. Without prayer, we become self-reliant, absorbing truth and enjoying fellowship with one another, but lacking power.

When we pray, we practice the presence of God and begin to experience His power. So, we are commanded to pray without ceasing. When we bow before our Father, we worship and adore Him. At the same time, we are reminded of our absolute dependence upon Him.

Prayer is personal. Each of us grows deep in our love for God as we spend time alone with Him. Each of us needs to set aside a regular time and place to bask in His presence, listening to Him speak to us by His Spirit through His Word and opening our hearts in response. But one time slot per day isn't communion. That is more like "checking in." We need to practice His presence, sharing every moment of our day in communion with Him as our Father.

Prayer is also communal. We are His children, His family, His temple. As Solomon dedicated the temple, he focused on the importance of prayer in that place. God spoke through Isaiah, *"these I will* bring to my holy mountain, and make them joyful in my house of prayer." (Isaiah 56:7) Jesus said, "It is written, My house shall be called a house of prayer." (Matthew 21:13) It is right then, even necessary, that when we gather, we pray.

HPBC offers many opportunities for prayer. Let's pray this year like never before.

- We pray together on Sunday mornings.
- The Prayer Room is open all day for those who want to pray, either in solitude or with brothers and sisters in Christ.
- We take prayer walks together in the neighborhood around the church and in our city.
- Men and women have regular gatherings to pray.
- We pray as Boards, in Grow Groups, in Go Groups, and during Sunday worship.

Let's pray together that God would do among us what only He can do, so that only He can receive the glory!

MEN'S MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS:

The men's weekend retreat at Spring Hill Camps was a fun time away with many activities, while growing in relationship with God and connecting with others. Our theme for that weekend was, "Stand Firm in the Faith" from 1 Corinthians 16:13-14.

We held our first annual **Rib Wars** event and hosted 75 men who voted to name the Master Chef. It was a great time fellowshipping, worshiping, and spending time together.

WOMEN'S MINISTRY AT A GLANCE:

- **200+ women** attended our weekly Bible studies, prayer time, MOTS (Moms of Toddlers) group, and our monthly special events
- 100+ women attended our seminar on Sharing the Good News

WOMEN'S MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS:

- An exciting number of women came to believe in our Lord and Savior Jesus, and they pursued discipleship to grow in faith and knowledge.
- Many new ladies joined our study of the book of Acts where we learned about the amazing spread of the gospel message and the powerful work of the Holy Spirit transforming the hearts and lives of the first followers of Jesus.
- Each Wednesday morning, women gathered for a time of praise, worship, and intercession for the needs of our church family, community, and world.
- Moms received support, encouragement, and gospel truth for their daily lives as they care for their families and disciple their little ones.
- Many fun events like our **"Ladies Night Out"** activities, missions lunches, Christmas Tea, and a "Mother/Daughter" event were also held throughout the year for women of all ages.

PRAYER MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS:

- Church Boards regularly begin their gatherings with extended prayer and gather three times a year for an hour of prayer together.
- Pre-service prayer each Sunday morning from 8:45-9:15. All are welcome.
- Women's prayer every Wednesday morning.
- About 50 women gathered for an extended day of prayer.
- Men gather the last Saturday of every month for a morning of prayer and gathered every Tuesday morning during the summer for prayer.
- Hundreds of prayer requests gathered on prayer tags throughout the year and prayed for multiple times for several weeks at a time.
- Many prayer groups meet during the month to pray over: adult children, our country, missions, and reflective prayer.

HPBC STUDENTS AT A GLANCE:

- 100+ students attended retreats
- 8 events held throughout the year
- 7 students served during Spring Serve Week
- 20 students served during our Summer Serve Week
- 20 students on average attended the mid-Monday lunches during the summer

MISSIONS

God called and has given HPBC 12 new workers to the least-reached people in nations that are antagonistic to the Good News. Following the global pandemic, we, together with our kingdom workers, are pressing back into ministries full tilt making disciples to reach our neighborhoods and nations. It was encouraging to send short-term teams to Poland, Ukraine, and Greece this year. The Strategic Mission Fund advanced the gospel in noteworthy ways, by allowing HPBC to respond with mercy to disasters and wars. We are grateful for all our missionaries that we are blessed to support, and to all who gave above and beyond to our Strategic Mission Fund.

SHORT-TERM MISSIONS TRIPS

UKRAINE AND POLAND:

We sent a team to assist and encourage Ukrainian and Polish believers at the Mission Eurasia iCare Refugee Center in Warsaw through children's and adult outreach opportunities during their Christmas season. This team served alongside HPBC missionaries, Don and Esther Parsons, in their ministry to Ukrainian refugees.

ATHENS


We sent a team of eight to Athens, Greece to serve alongside Alexander Macris and Hellenic Ministries to host a teen camp for a week with refugees and local teens.

DESCRIPTION OF BOARD RESPONSIBILITIES

ELDER BOARD

Oversees the spiritual health and direction of the church. Oversees the senior pastor and all the other boards of the church.

DEACON BOARD

Works alongside the deaconess board in caring for the practical needs of the congregation and assists the elders in ministering to the spiritual needs of the fellowship.

DEACONESS BOARD

Works alongside the deacon board in caring for the practical needs of the congregation and assists the elders in ministering to the spiritual needs of the fellowship.

TRUSTEE BOARD

Oversees the maintenance and development of all church property and facilities.

MISSION BOARD

Works with the Missions Pastor in screening new missionary candidates, communicating with HPBC missionaries, caring for missionary needs, and promoting missions to the greater church body.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE

Nominates biblically-qualified church members, as determined by the elder board, for election to all of the church boards.

SCS SCHOOL BOARD

Oversees all matters pertaining to the operation of the school, including the course of instruction, admissions, personnel, accreditation, budget, and finances. The SCS school board oversees the work of the head of school.
