

Exodus 12

Exodus is a physical picture of New Testament spiritual truths.

In the story of the Passover, we find a portrait of the gospel.

Passover points us forward to:

- Who we once were
- Who Jesus is
- Who we have become

Passover reminds us of our deliverance from sin and death.

The Passover lamb points forward to Jesus, our Redeemer.

Passover tells the story of new life, of re-birth.

Unleavened Bread reminds us of:

- Our new identity
- Our new walk
- Jesus, our perfect example

Unleavened Bread reminds us of our new life as free children of God.

Unleavened Bread reminds us to live in our new identity.

Unleavened Bread is a picture of Jesus.

The LORD's Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread were opportunities:

- To look back and remember
- To look back and proclaim
- To look back and worship with other children of God

These two feasts lead us to remember.

These two feasts call us to proclaim why we keep them.
